

## 2023/2024 PCFA Scientific & Financial Report

## **PCFA Reporting Guidelines**

These reports serve two purposes:

- 1. They are a formal requirement for individual accountability and compliance with the intended aims of PCFA's grant scheme.
- 2. They are an essential source of information for our publications: Prostate News, Annual Report and Research Program website.
  - We use lay summaries of your progress to update men living with prostate cancer, and their families, and our donors about outcomes of prostate cancer research.
  - We update the community at large about advances in prostate cancer research nationally via interviews and media releases.

## **Scientific Reporting Requirements**

A scientific report should provide:

- Annual progress please give details of progress referring separately to each aim and/or objective as stated in the original application.
- Details regarding any delays and the impact on the overall research progress.
- Any technical difficulties and an explanation of how you plan to overcome such difficulties.
- Electronic copy of any journal or media articles published during the award period

#### **Financial Report Requirements**

Financial reports are provided separately and must be an internally audited financial report from the Administering Institution against the approved Grant budget (i.e., financial reports must be certified and signed by a senior accountant at the Administering Institute). All expenditure reported should be in accordance with the budget requested in the application.

The financial report must include justification for funds unspent, to be carried over or returned. Carry-over of funds remaining up to 25% of the grant budget must be justified; funds remaining over 25% will automatically revert to PCFA.

\*PCFA will suspend payment of further instalments until the scientific report, the financial report and, if applicable, a request to carry forward unspent funds have been submitted and assessed as satisfactory. Please advise us if you anticipate any reporting delays. Please also notify your administering institution's grant office and finance department of any delays to the submission of reports, so that they are aware of the reason for any outstanding invoices they may have sent on your behalf.
